



The United Nations Mission in Sudan (UNMIS) in Sector I is donating time and supplies to improve conditions at the Juba Orphanage, home to about 50 children. Under the committed guidance of the Juba-based Joint Monitoring and Coordination Office (JMCO), the Bangladeshi, Danish and Indian contingents are renovating and repairing the orphanage building and grounds.

A peacekeeper with carpentry skills from the Danish contingent has already been deployed from Khartoum and supervised repairs of childrens' cots and living areas. Sports equipment and a new volleyball court have been donated by the Danes.

A renovation project has been outlined for broader repairs on the orphanage. The Bangladeshi Engineering Company has recommended structural repairs of the broken floors, damaged widow screens, glass and electrical wiring. The plumbing system is also to be overhauled, providing running water and a septic system.
